Adam I. Riker, MD, FACS is the current Medical Director of the Melanoma Program for the Advocate Cancer Institute, Advocate Christ Medical Center in Oak Lawn, Illinois. He is a Fellow of the American College of Surgeons and founding member of the Society for Melanoma Research. His clinical practice is focused exclusively on treating patients with melanoma and

breast cancer. He has previously completed a three-year surgical oncology fellowship at the prestigious National Cancer Institute, developing an on-going interest in the development of immunotherapy trials for patients with metastatic melanoma.

Dr. Riker also spent 4 years at the Moffitt Cancer Center and Research Institute, an NCI-designated Comprehensive Cancer Center, having one of the highest volume practices devoted to melanoma patients. He continues to have a very busy clinical practice in treating melanoma patients, and is also the Principal Investigator on several novel immunotherapeutic and gene therapy clinical trials for patients with metastatic melanoma.
